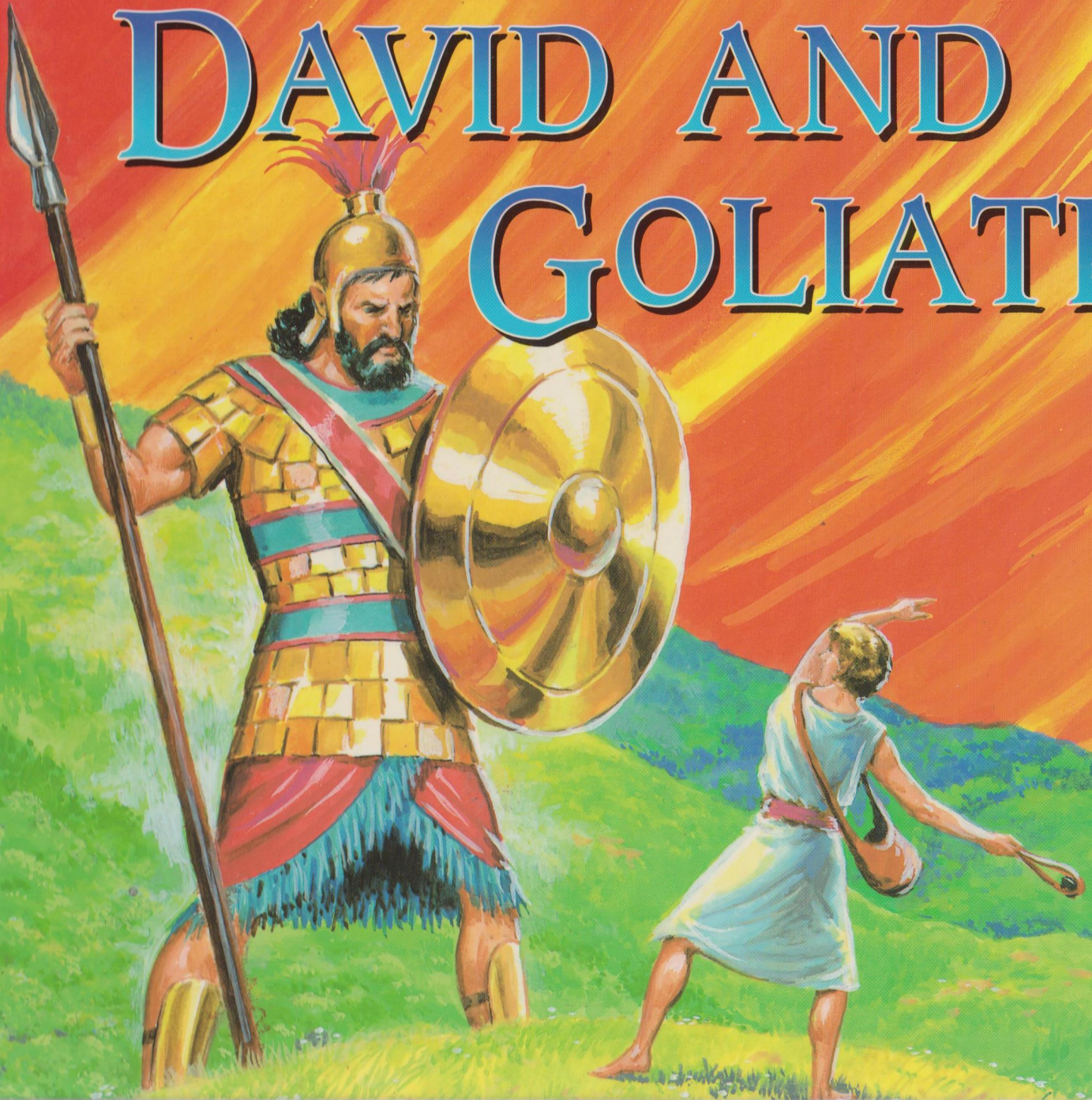
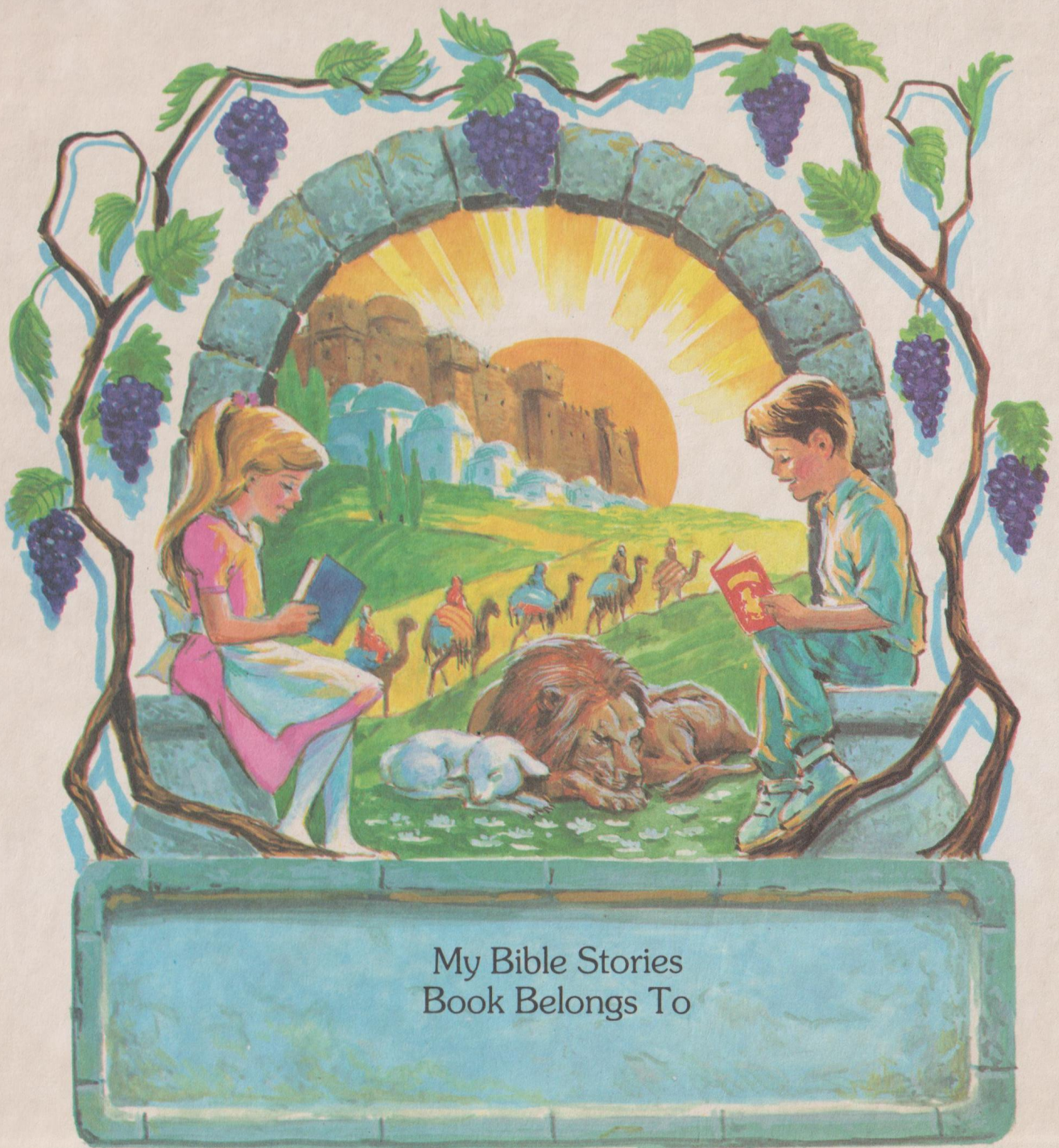

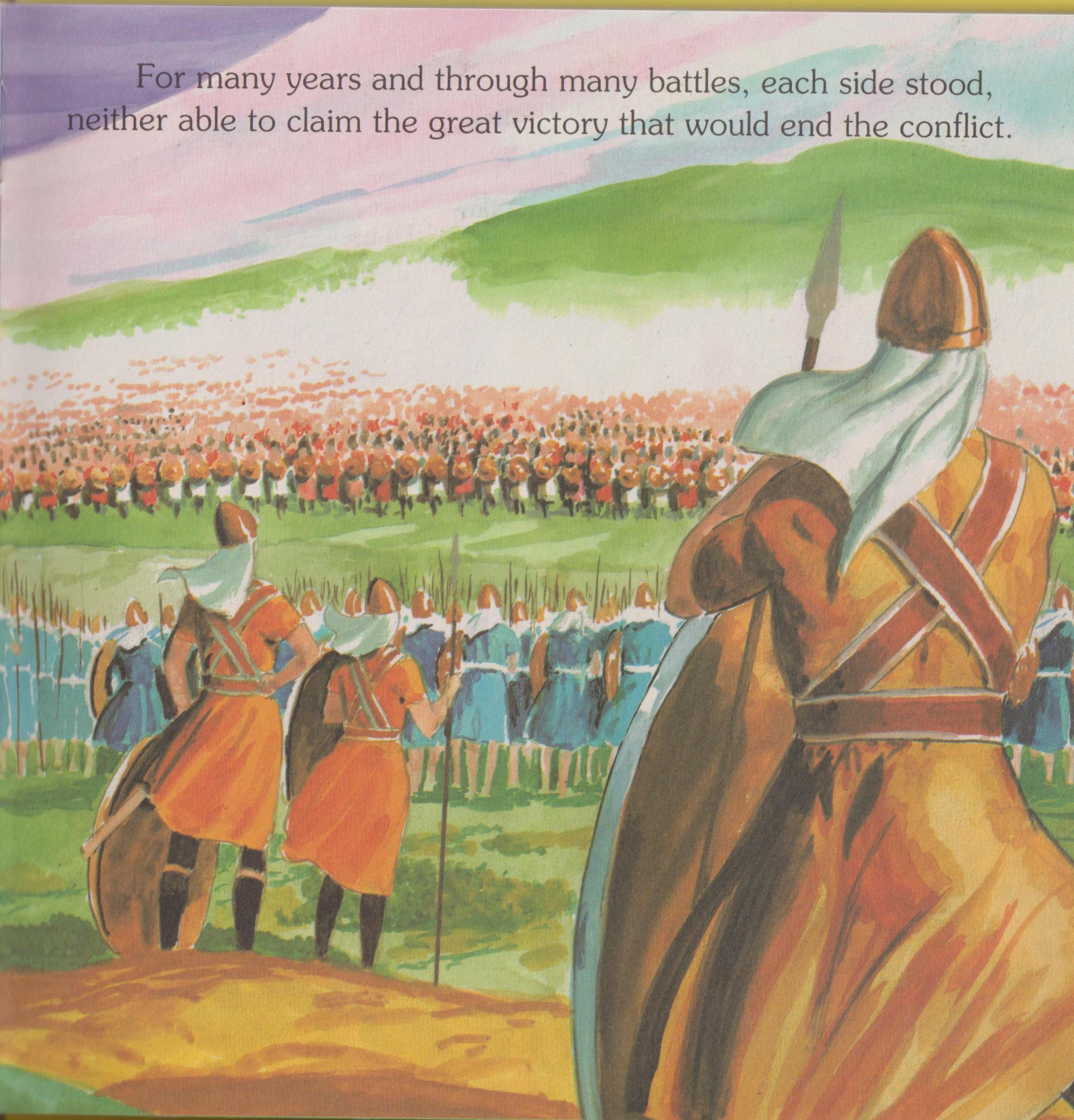

For many years and through many battles, each side stood, neither able to claim the great victory that would end the conflict.

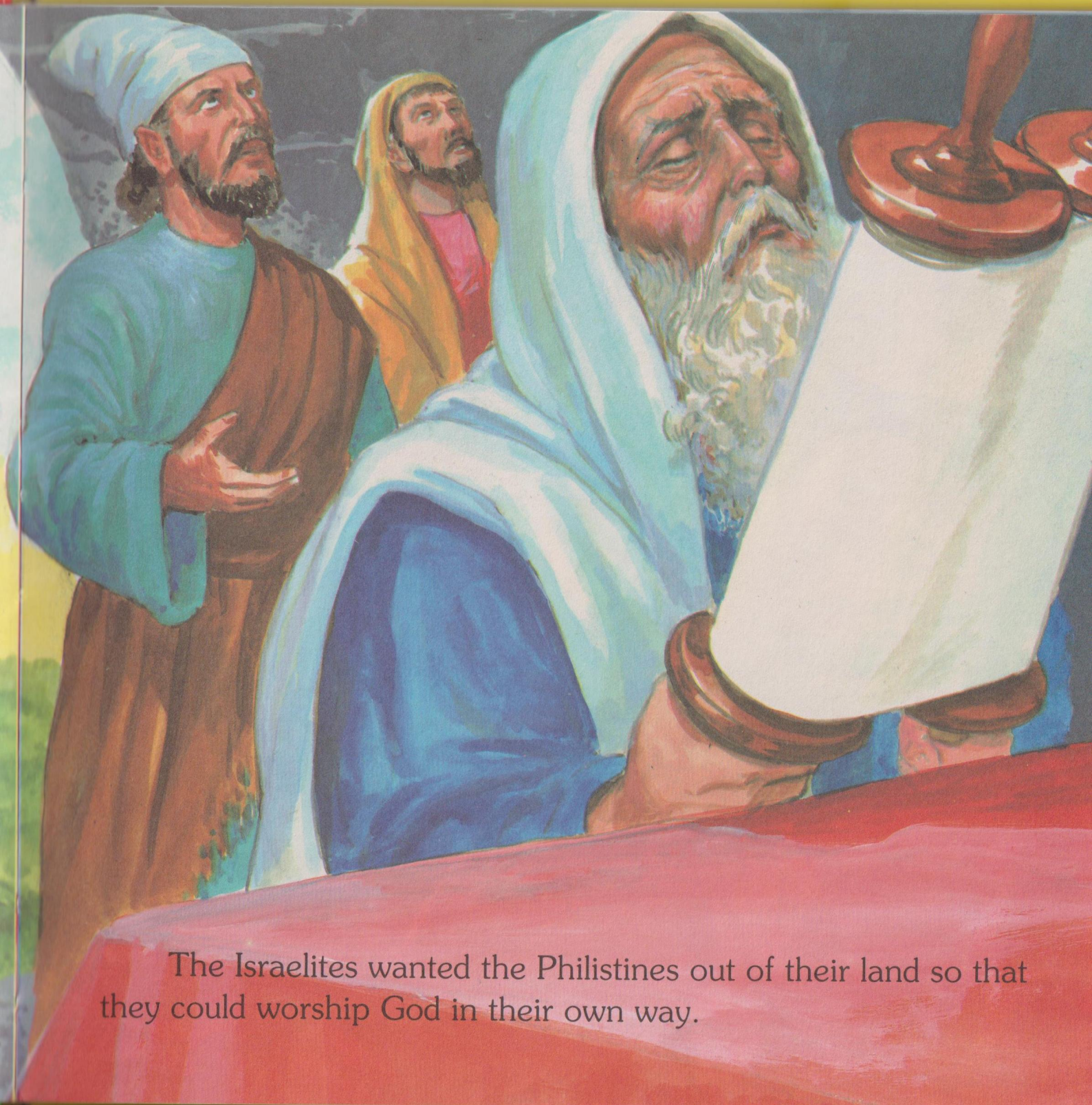


In the valley of Elah, two great armies faced each other, that of the Philistines and that of the Israelites, led by King Saul.



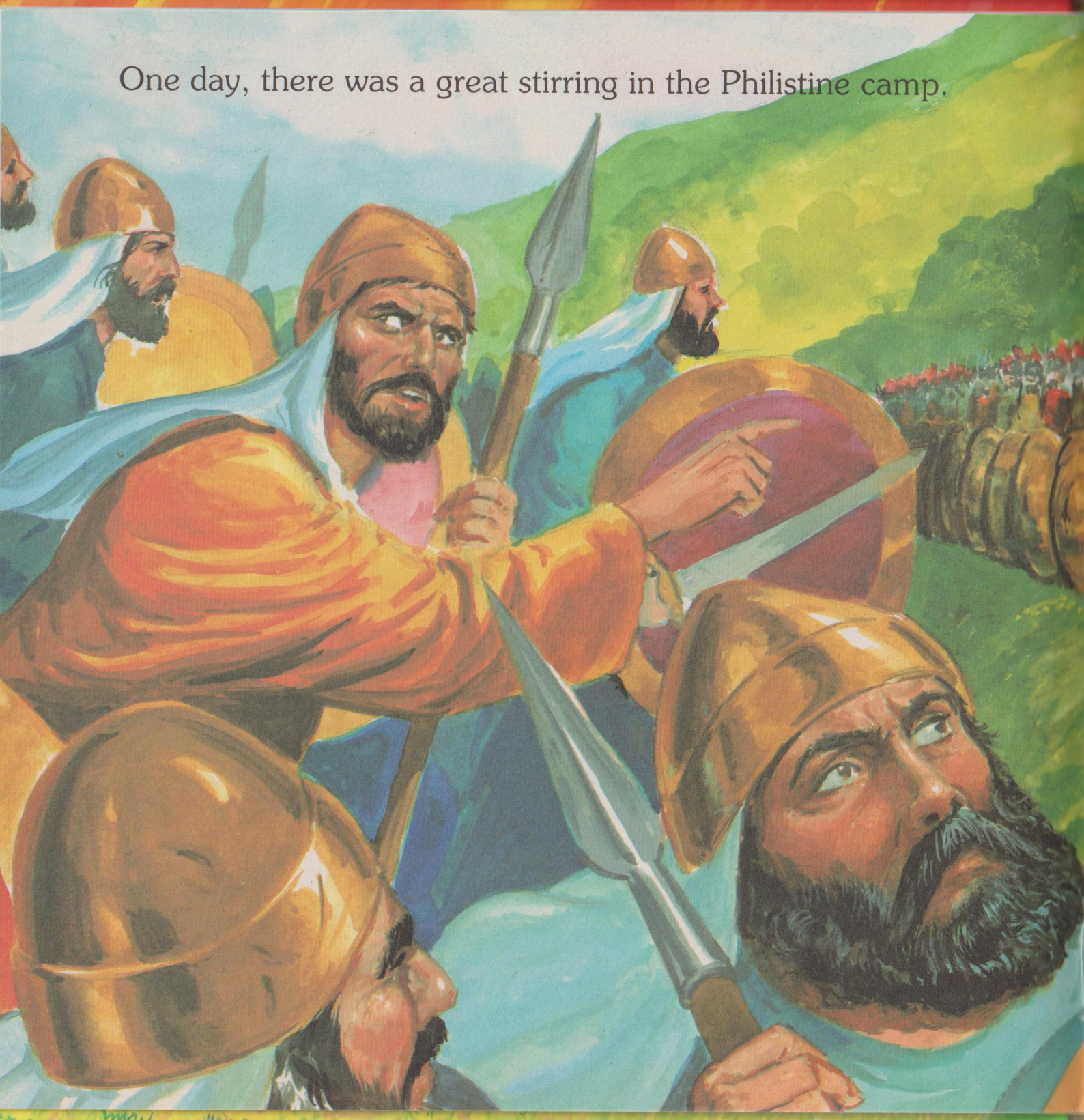
The Philistines were idol-worshippers and bowed to many gods, but the Israelites prayed only to their Lord, whom they knew was the one true God.





The Israelites wanted the Philistines out of their land so that they could worship God in their own way.

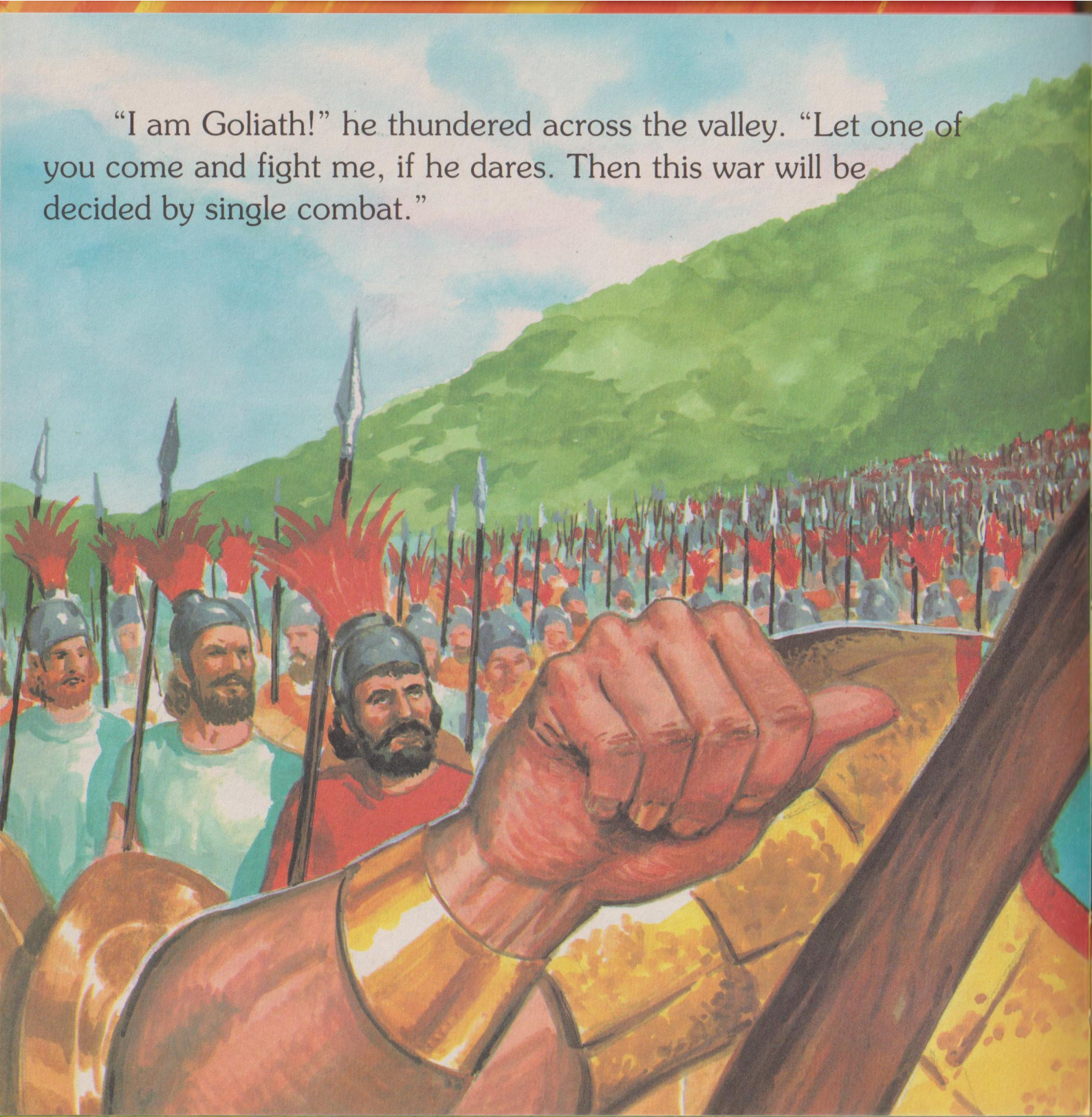
One day, there was a great stirring in the Philistine camp.

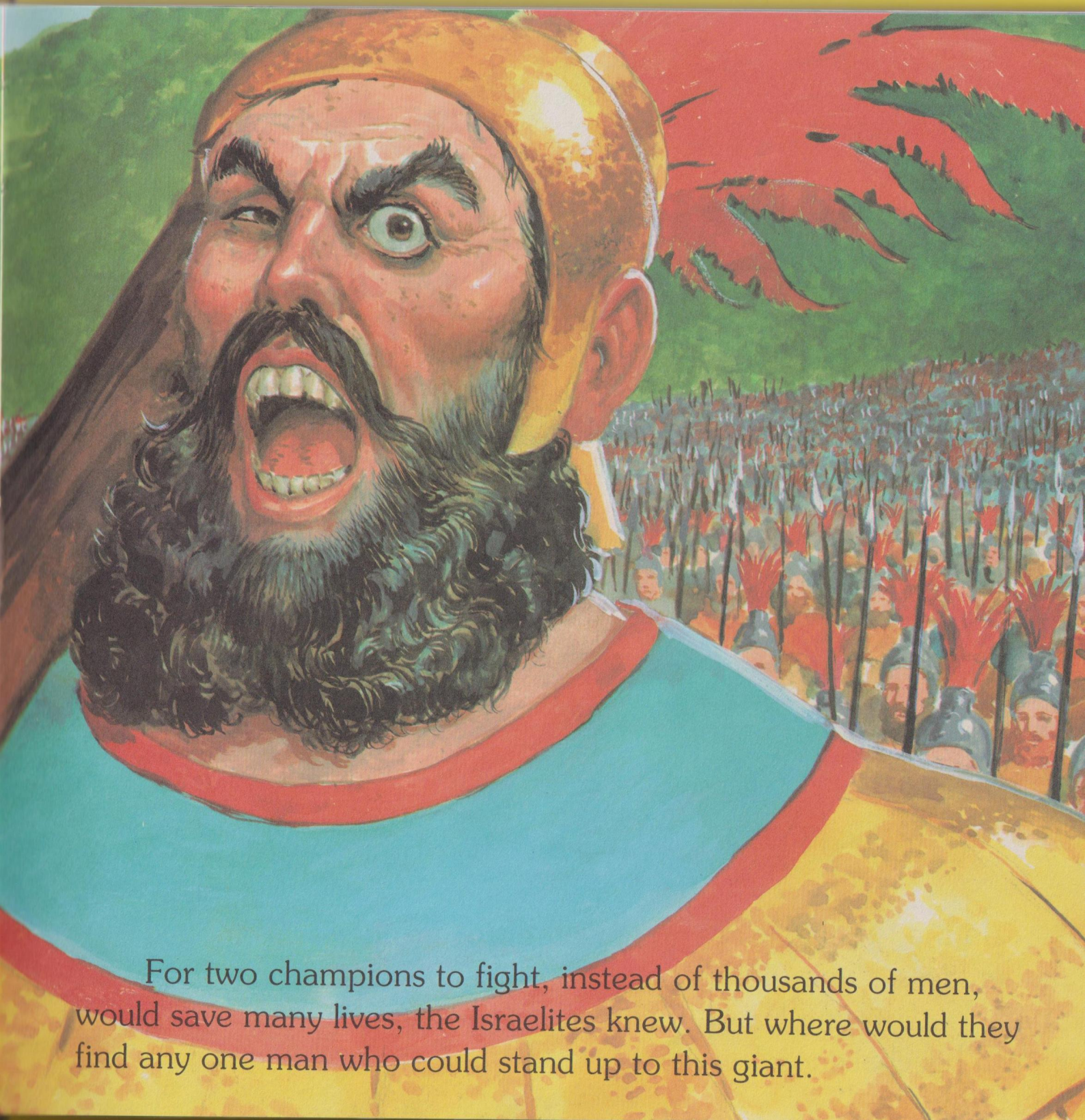

“I am Goliath!” he thundered across the valley. “Let one of you come and fight me, if he dares. Then this war will be decided by single combat.”





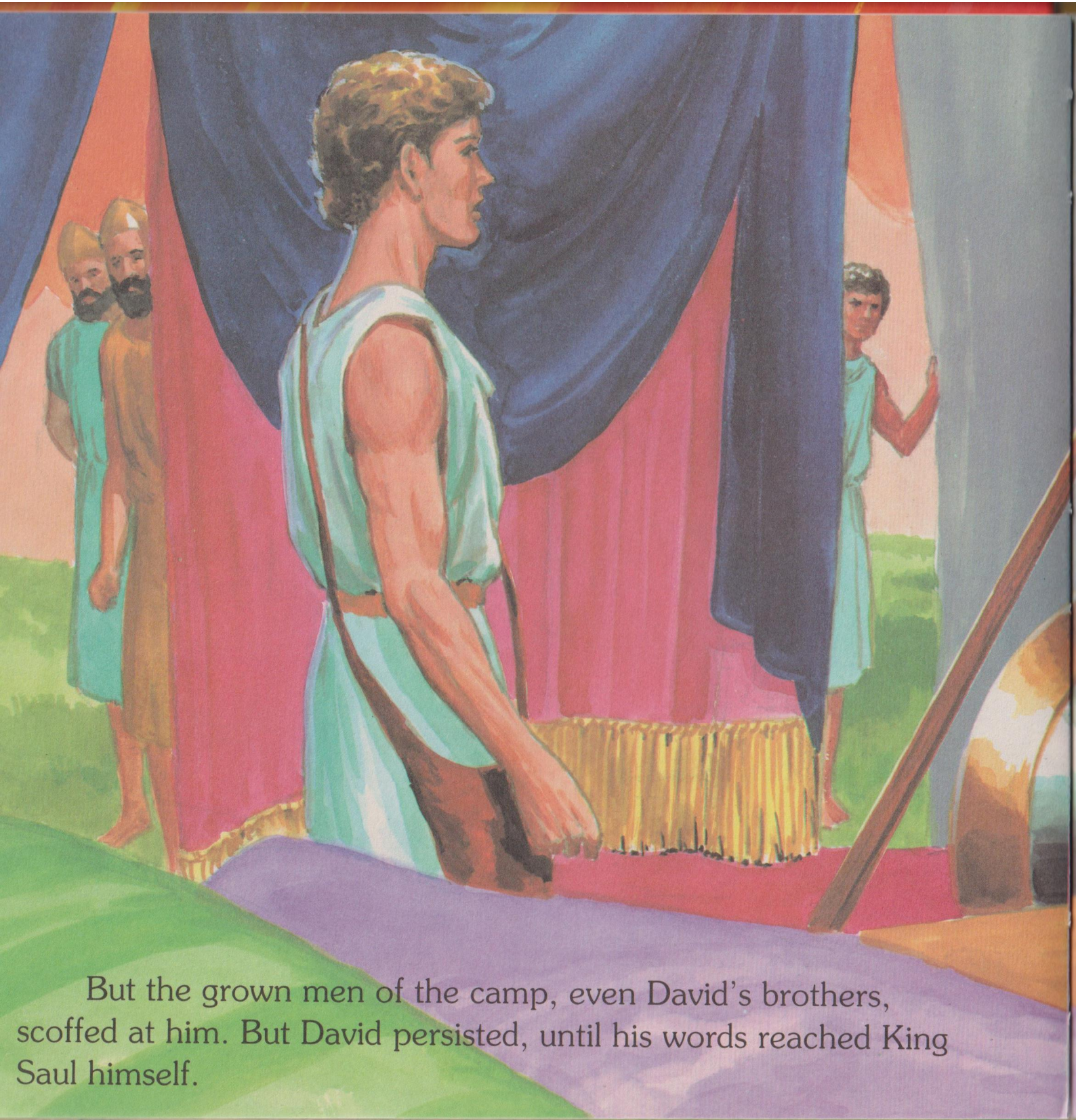
For two champions to fight, instead of thousands of men, would save many lives, the Israelites knew. But where would they find any one man who could stand up to this giant.

“Who is this Philistine who dares defy the army of God?” the boy David asked. “I will fight him.”

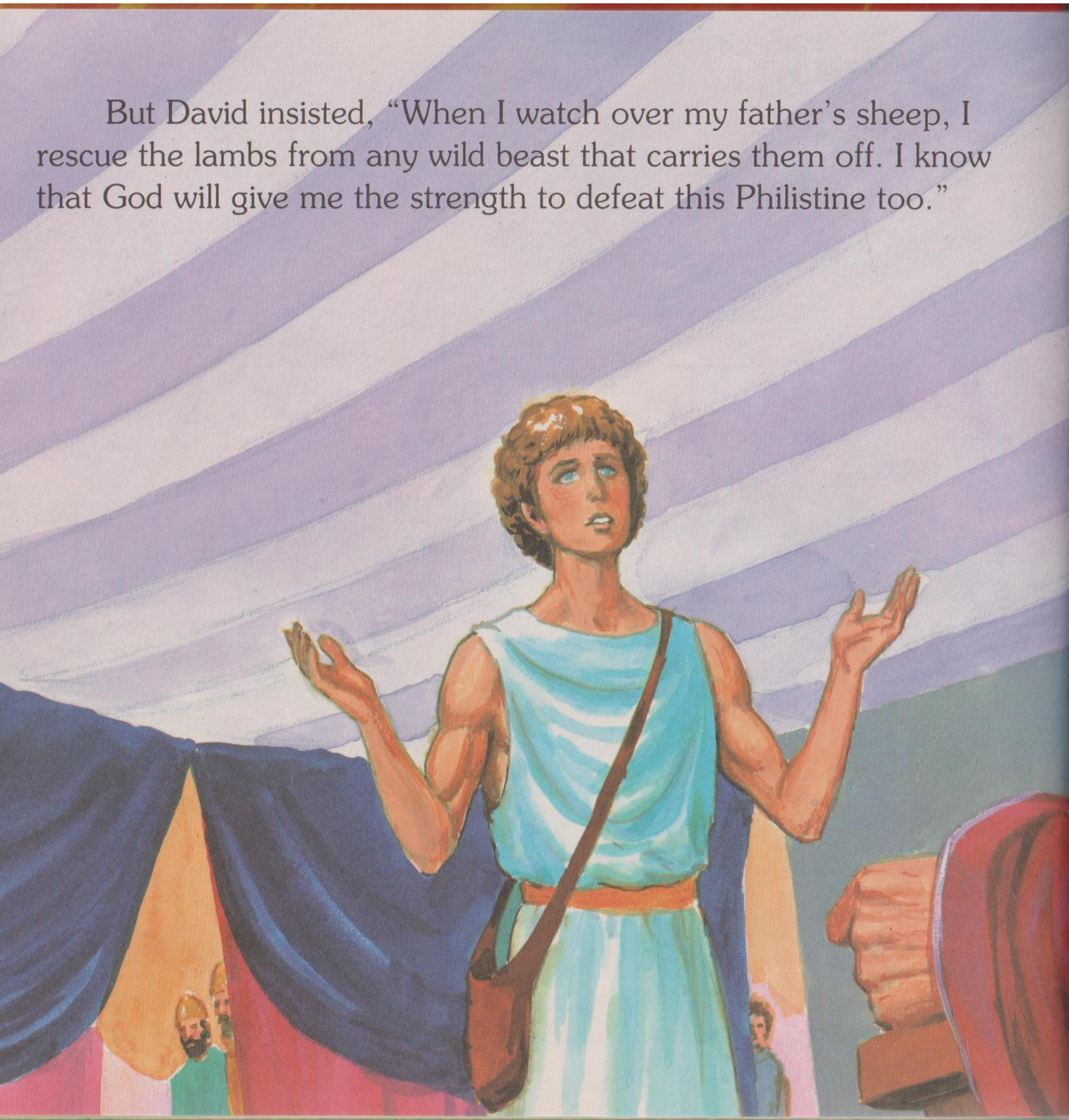


But the grown men of the camp, even David's brothers, scoffed at him. But David persisted, until his words reached King Saul himself.



“You are only a boy,” said the King. “We cannot let a boy go against a giant.”

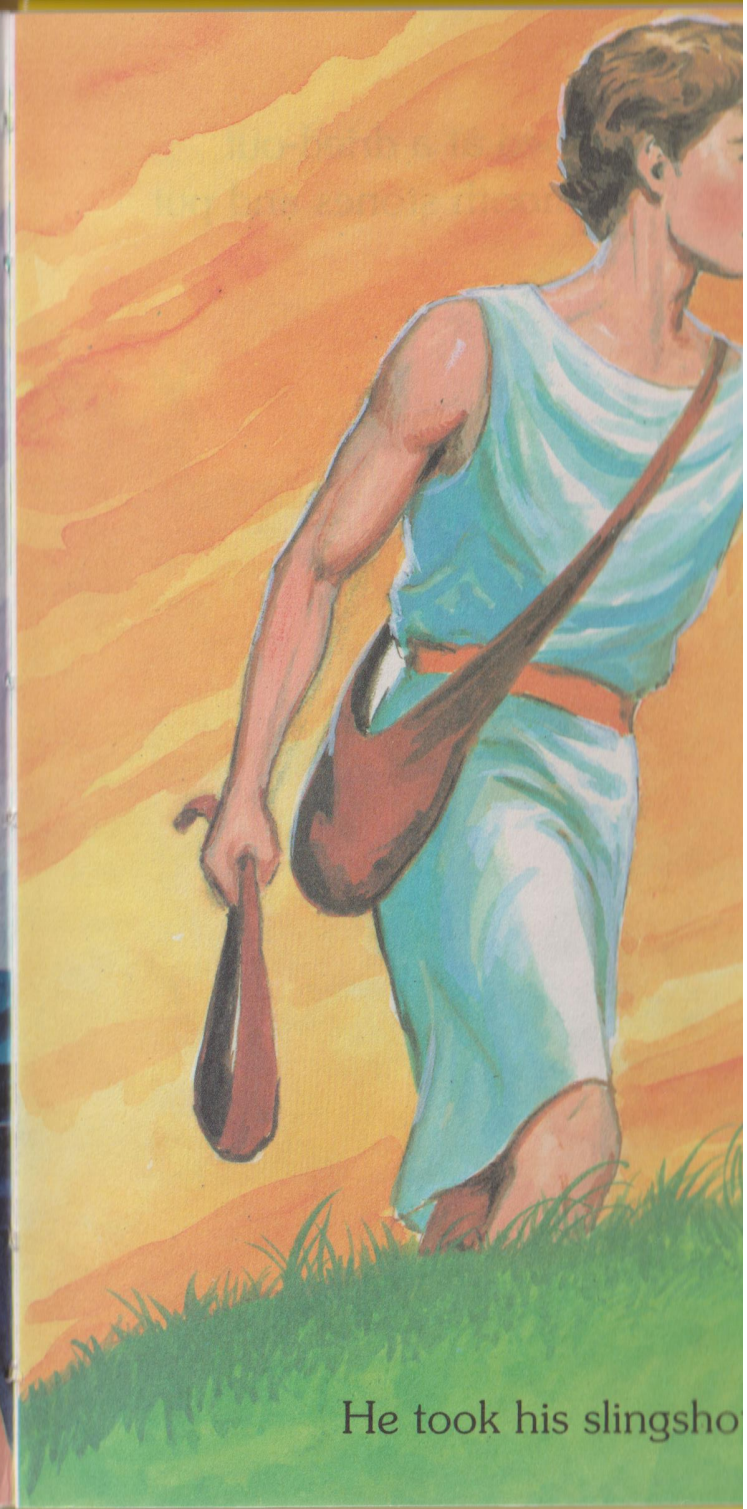

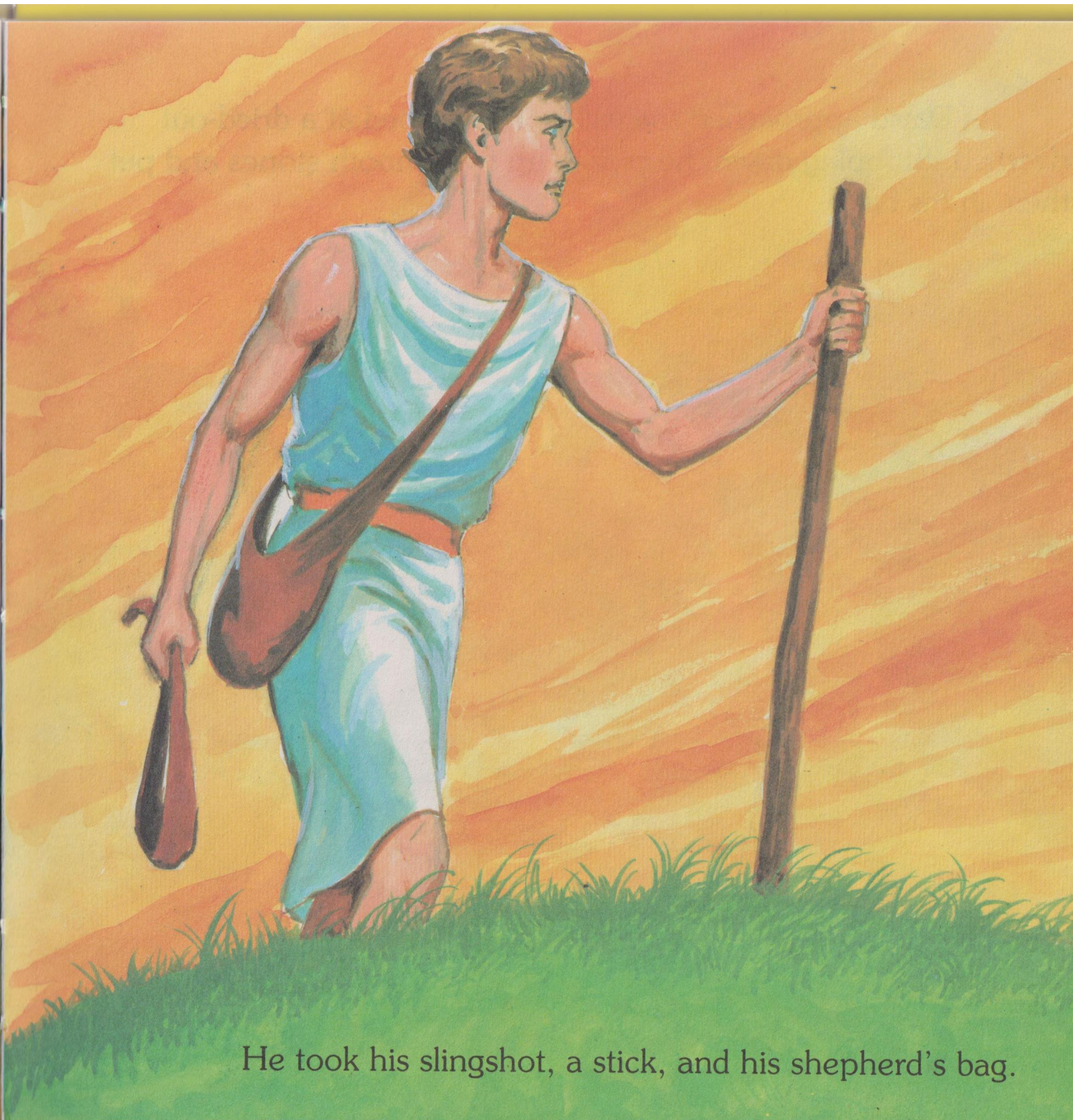


At last, the King gave in. He offered David his own armor and weapons to use against Goliath.

He took his slingsho



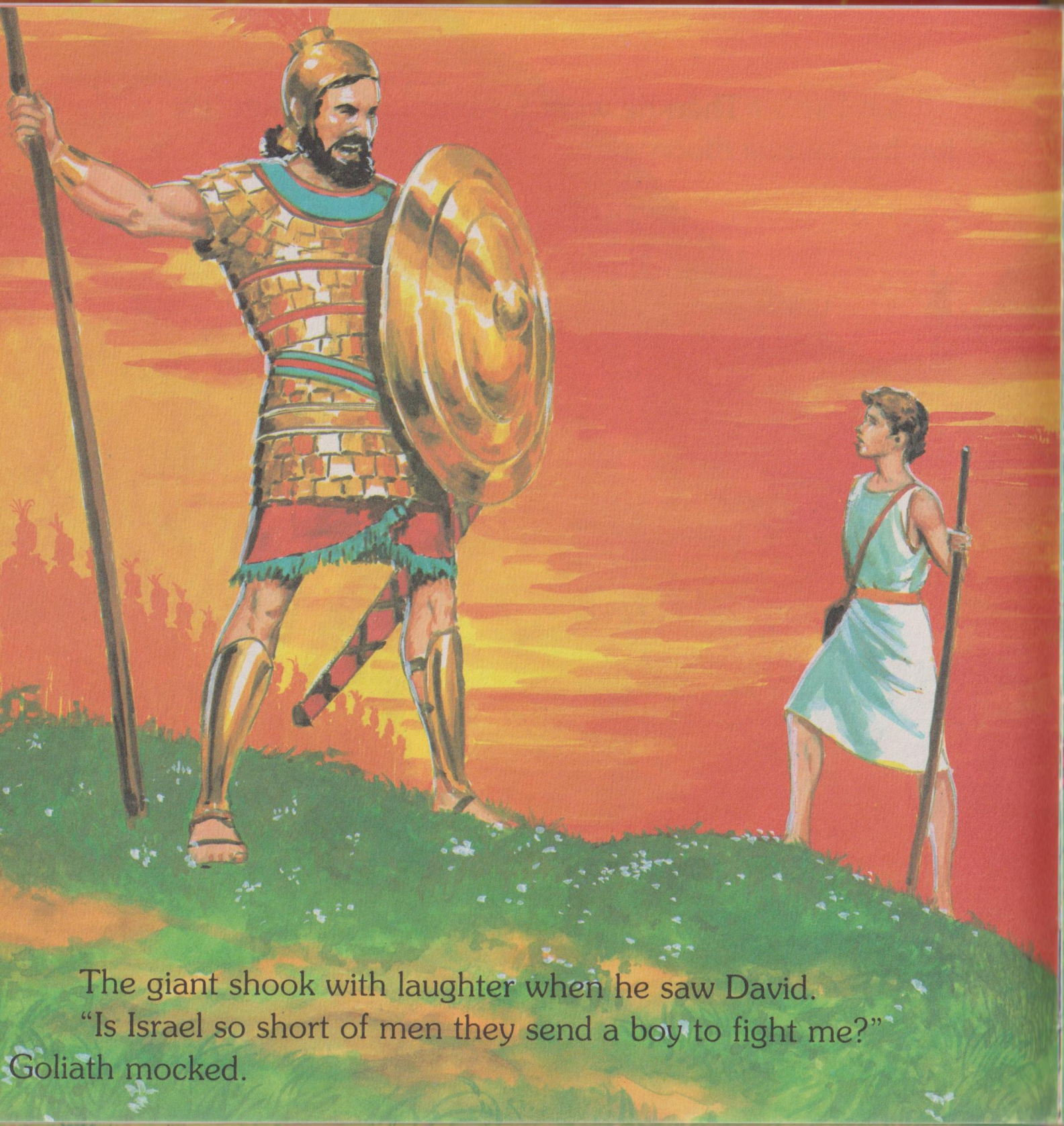
He took his slingshot, a stick, and his shepherd's bag.

Then he went forth to face Goliath.

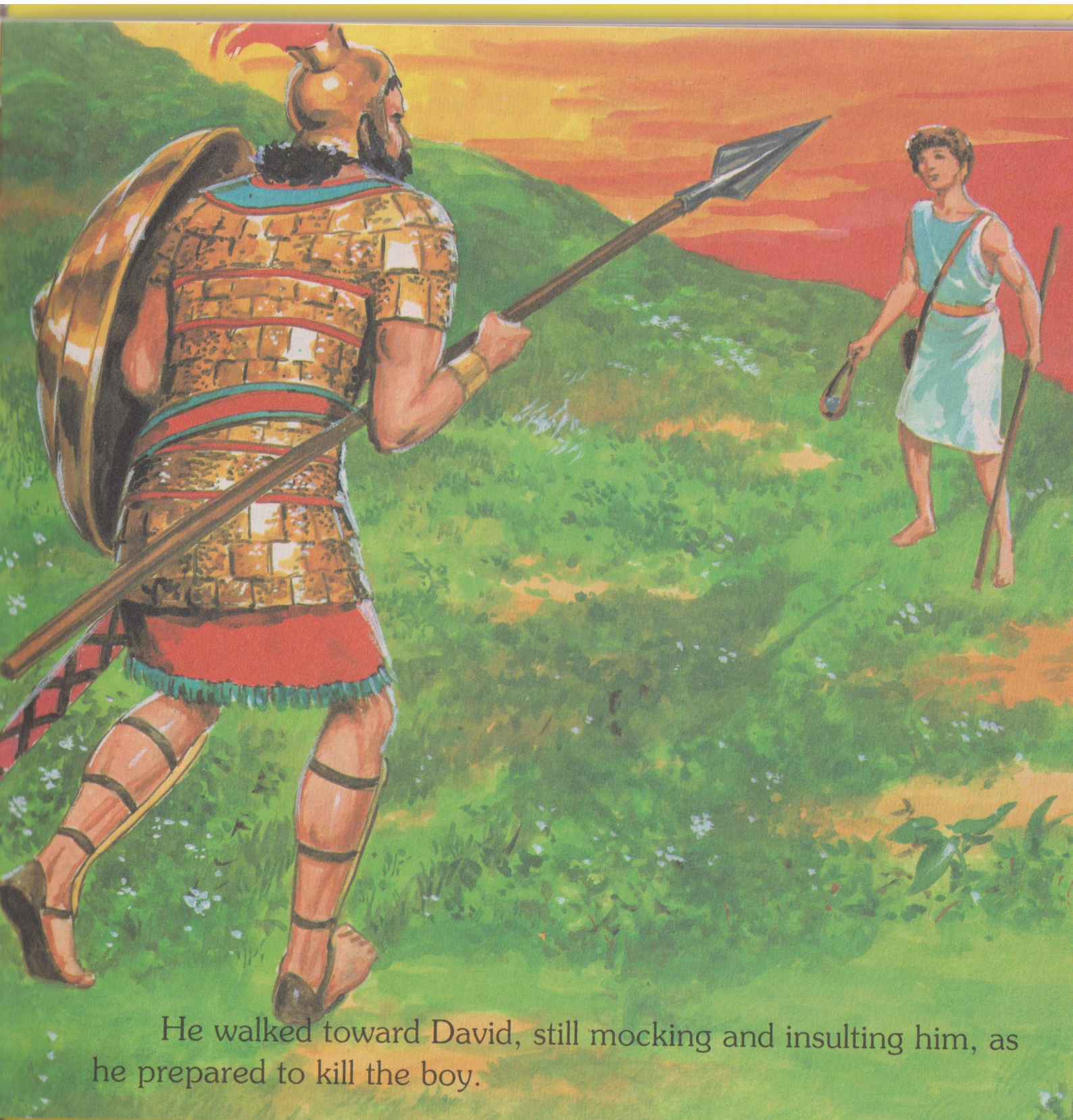




The giant shook with laughter when he saw David.

Goliath mocked.

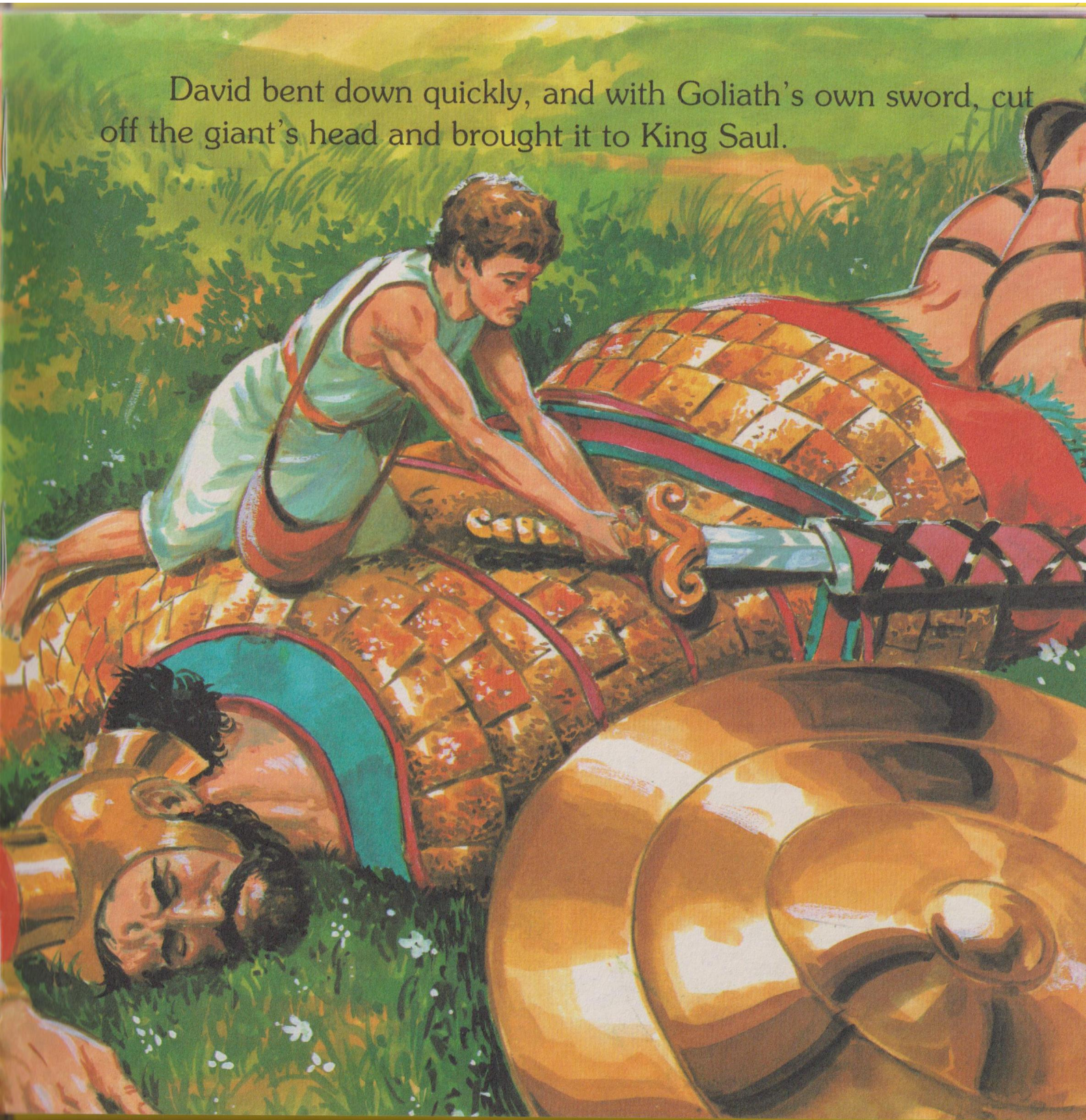


He walked toward David, still mocking and insulting him, as he prepared to kill the boy.

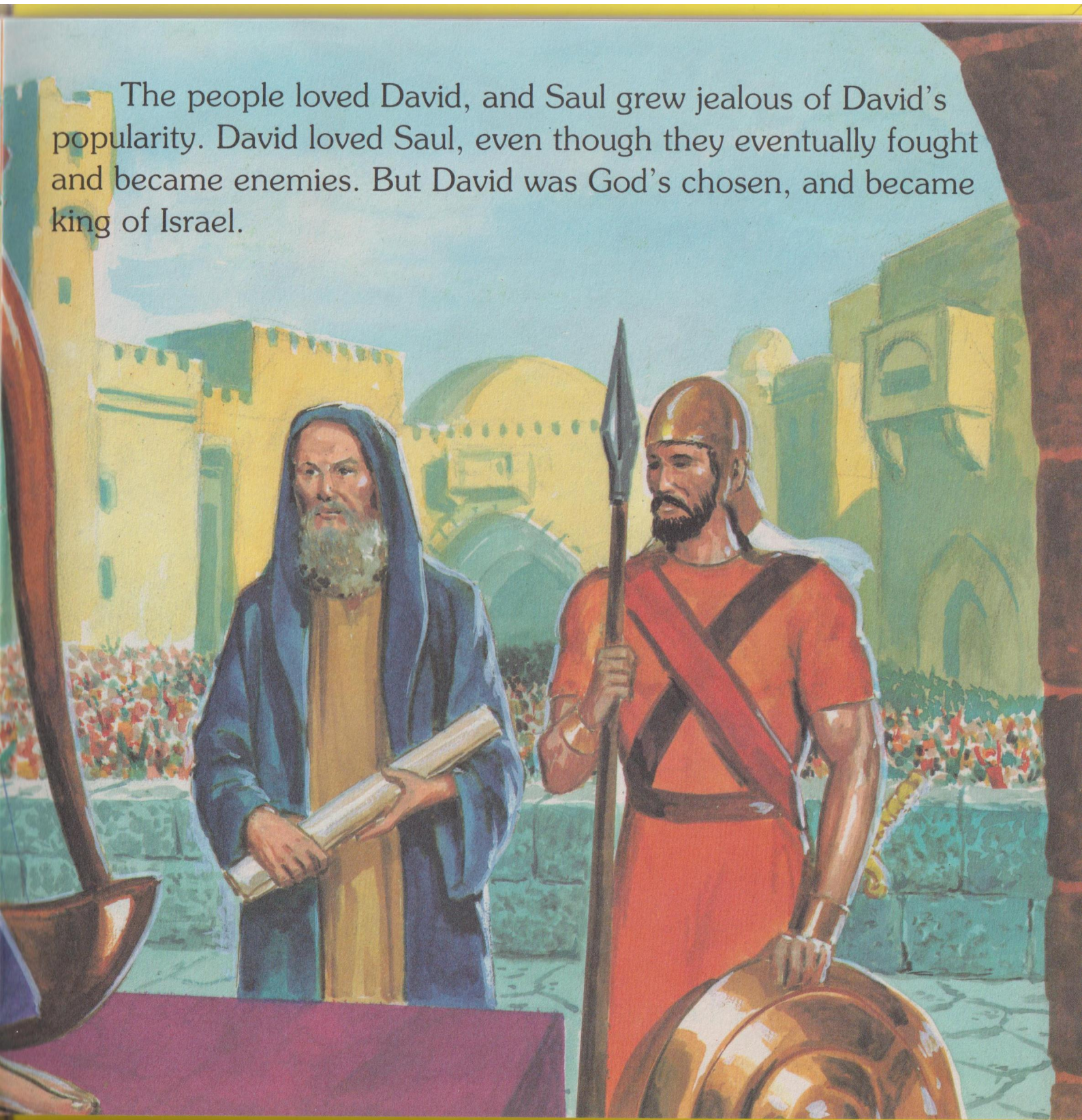


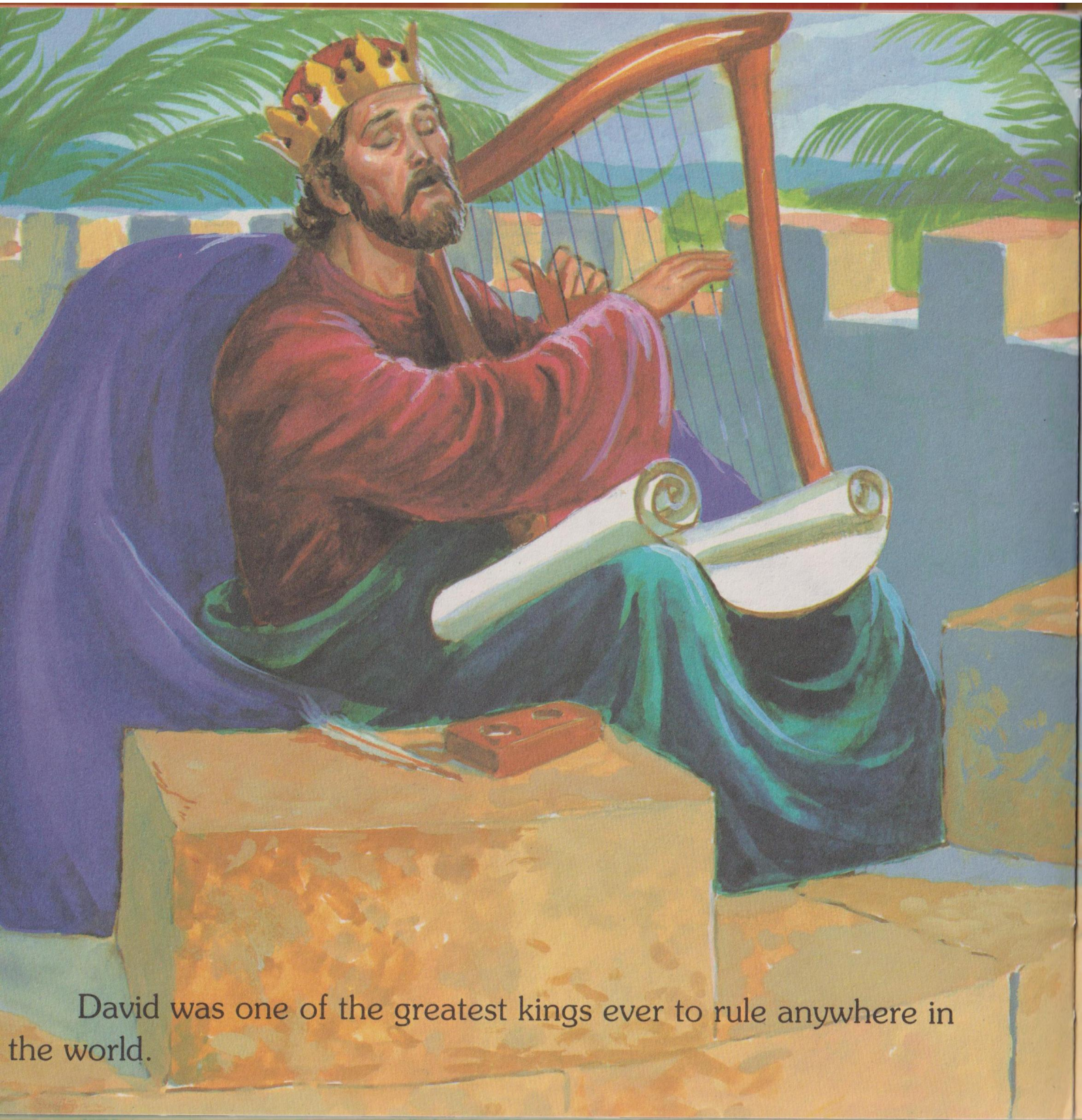
David bent down quickly, and with Goliath's own sword, cut off the giant's head and brought it to King Saul.



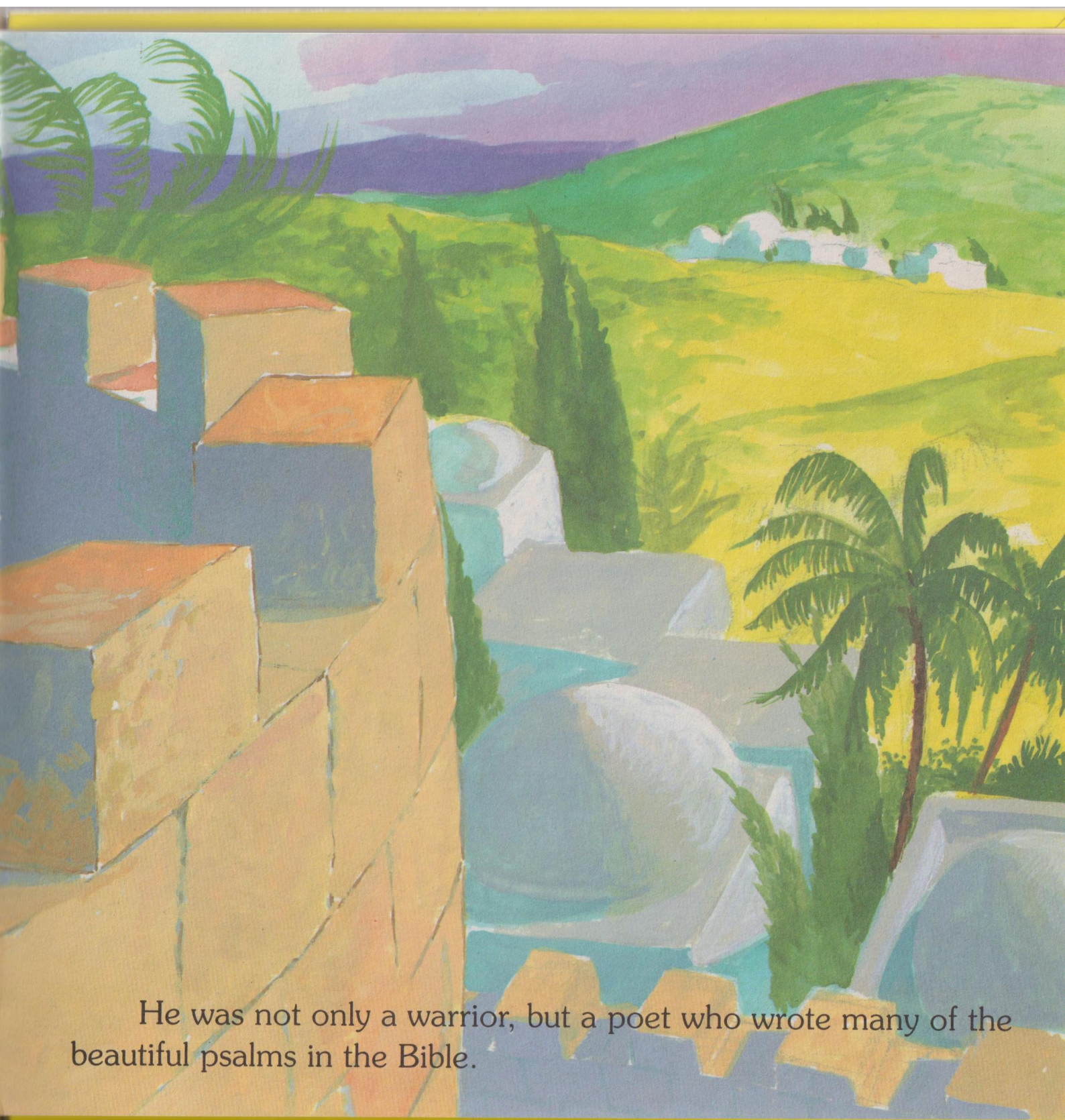

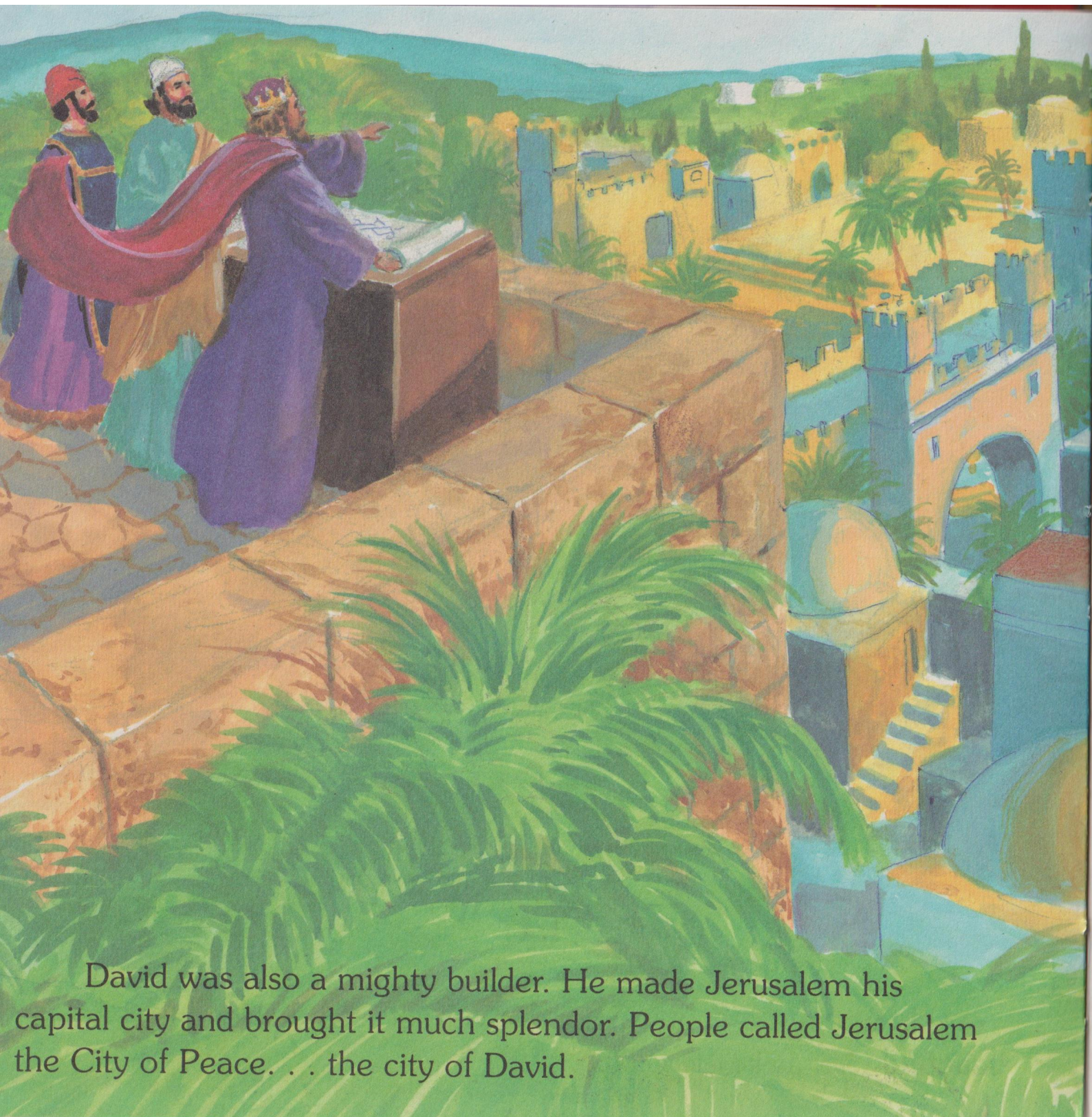




David was one of the greatest kings ever to rule anywhere in the world.
